# **Biographical Narrative**

Jonathan Brilliant was born in 1976 in Charleston, South Carolina. Brilliant holds a B.A. in studio art from the College of Charleston and an M.F.A. in Spatial Arts from San Jose State University. Brilliant is a recipient of an individual artist grant from the Pollock-Krasner Foundation and is a South Carolina Arts Commission Visual Arts Fellow. He has exhibited his work in several group and solo exhibitions nationally and internationally. He has received numerous fellowships to artist residencies and communities including McColl Center for Visual Art, Charlotte, NC; The Ox-Bow School of Art, Saugatuck, MI; The Vermont Studio Center, Johnson, VT; Redux Contemporary Art Center, Charleston, SC; Artspace, Raleigh, NC and The East/West Project in Berlin Germany. He has served as a visiting artist for The University of Oklahoma, Norman Oklahoma, Kendall College of Art and Design, Grand Rapids, MI; University of Memphis, TN; Coastal Carolina University, Conway, SC; and Winthrop University, Rock Hill, SC among others. From May 2009-December 2010 he conducted his Have Sticks Will Travel: World Tour, a marathon series of site-specific installations that took place in thirteen galleries in eighteen months, in three countries, on two continents, and included a stop at the Bumbershoot Festival in Seattle, WA. In 2011 he was the Artist-in-Residence at the Visual Arts Center of Richmond, VA, where he created a comprehensive multi-room installation utilizing coffee shop ephemera. In 2012 he served as an Artist in Residence at the Cairns Festival in Far North Queensland Australia, and at the Center for Creativity and the arts at CSU Fresno, California. He currently lives with his wife Brooke, son Asher and two cats Zero and Chicken in Raleigh North Carolina.

## **Statement of Artistic Intent**

"In addition to his work as visual artist, Jonathan Brilliant is a drummer. It's a good fact to know about him upfront as the cadence and underlying pulse inherent to such percussive sensibilities impart an edge to his art that explains a lot about what's happening. There are distinct tempos, repetitions and an underlying structure in his artwork. These Rhythmic qualities lend a certain presence and pattern to his installations where you can literally feel the vibe" -Dave Delcambre, October 2010 Artsee Magazine

In 2006 I began my "Goldsworthy of the coffee shop project" initially assuming the role of a British artist who gathers materials in his natural environment and uses them to execute a site-specific installation. In my version the natural environment was the coffee shop, and my materials were the to-go coffee cup and all it's accoutrements. The resulting work was both ironic and labor intensive with a traditional craft based sensibility. In this ongoing series of work, I now continue to explore my sense that the coffee shop and related materials are more organic and nurturing than the "real" natural environment.

In 2009 I transitioned into my current mode of working, under the "Have Sticks Will Travel: World Tour 09-10". Since this time I have for the most part abandoned traditional studio production in favor of gallery installations. My work for this series is assembled on site and creates a specific sculptural response to the time and space provided. The palette of materials used to realize these installations consists exclusively of materials related to the to-go coffee cup culture. Materials including, coffee cup sleeves, coffee cup lids, coffee grounds, and straws are stacked arranged and affixed to the gallery space itself creating a visual dialog between coffee and architecture. Central to all of these installations are monumental woven coffee stir stick structures. Each installation contains 30,000-50,000 sticks. All the sticks used in these installations are woven in place entirely with tension and compression, no adhesive is used, creating an uncanny sculptural environment for the viewer to explore. These installations offer a unique experience where viewers are immersed in an environment created from nothing but the accoutrements of the contemporary to-go coffee cup.
